

To Do List for Nurses Seeking a Declaratory Order in Texas

If a candidate for admission has a criminal history they will need a declaratory order from the Texas Board of Nursing to be admitted to nursing school.

This is a list of what your nursing lawyer will need from you to assist in obtaining a declaratory order from the Texas Board of Nursing.

- To be admitted to a nursing program in the state of Texas, a criminal background check is required.
- Collect all documents regarding any arrests.
- If the candidate has a pending criminal case, collect the charging documents.
- A statement explaining the circumstances surrounding the arrest/conviction as well as why you want to attend nursing school.

***The same process applies if someone is in nursing school and is arrested. They will need a declaratory order to sit for the NCLEX.
